

The Build a Chair Challenge









The problem...

Despite extensive negotiations and contingency planning the Hotel has a shortage of seating in their restaurant.

They've spoken to the Faculty and we've agreed to step in as a group and help them solve the problem!





The Aim

To build a makeshift chair using items available from the Collaborative Shop

You have £5 in your packs to purchase your supplies

You have 30 minutes to design, build, test and modify your chair

A person needs to be able to sit on the chair for at least 1 minute once it is built



What's in the Shop...



Item	Number available	Cost
A bag of balloons	13 bags	£1 a bag
A roll of tape	10 rolls	£1 a roll
A bundle of string	2 bundles	£1 a bundle
A pair of scissors	1 pair of scissors	£1 for the scissors
Balloon pump (for hire only - 10 mins a time)	1 balloon pump	£1 for 10mins hire

^{*}NB once supplies are gone they are gone, the shop won't be replenished!



The Rules...



- ✓ Your chair must include blown up balloons in its construction
- ✓ You can only use items purchased within the shop to construct your chair
- ✓ You cannot buy more than 3 bags of balloons per table
- ✓ You cannot buy more than 2 rolls of tape per table.
- ✓ A person must be able to sit on your seat for at least 1 minute without your chair falling apart

Key Questions...

- How many tables successfully made a chair?
- How many tables didn't have enough resources?
- How many tables pooled their resources and worked together?
- How many tables shamelessly 'stole' the design ideas from others?





Think of this challenge as a local project

Some of the barriers you experienced in today's session are similar to the challenges you face day to day with your local projects. For example:

Item	Number available	Cost	Real world challenge
A bag of balloons	13 bags	£1 a bag	Limited money to support projects
A roll of tape	10 rolls	£1 a roll	The impact of staff shortages
A bundle of string	2 bundles	£1 a bundle	Limited resource in facilitating training to support staff
A pair of scissors	1 pair of scissors	£1 for the scissors	Having access to only one Activity Coordinator on a ward trying to reduce violence
Balloon pump (for hire only - 10 mins a time)	1 balloon pump	£1 for 10mins hire	Using an app to support your project that is only contracted for a specific period of time
